*Palm Sunday
A Model of Courage
and Determination*

And when he entered Jerusalem the whole city was shaken and asked, "Who is this?" And the crowds replied, "This is Jesus the prophet, from Nazareth in Galilee." Matthew 21:10-11

The commemoration of our Lord's Passion has begun. Today, Mass begins with the reading of Matthew's account of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Riding on a donkey, Jesus is greeted by a very large crowd who "spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and strewed them on the road" ([Matthew 21:8](#)). The people welcome Him with shouts of: "Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord; hosanna in the highest" ([Matthew 21:9](#)).

The word "Hosanna" in Hebrew means, "Save us, we pray!" Though it was originally a plea for deliverance, it became an expression of praise and joy, especially as it came to be associated with the Messiah's arrival. The phrase "Hosanna in the highest" calls for God, enthroned in Heaven, to bring His saving power to earth. The crowds' acclamation reveals both a hope for salvation and a recognition of Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah.

During Passover week, Jerusalem's population increased several times over with pilgrims from across Israel. The atmosphere was vibrant with religious fervor and communal celebration. Merchants sold sacrificial animals, food, and provisions to the crowds. Central to the festivities was the Temple where sacrifices were offered and the Passover lambs were prepared for the sacred meal. Roman authorities increased security, wary of potential unrest, as the commemoration of Israel's liberation from Egypt stirred hopes of national deliverance. The Jewish authorities were also on high alert, concerned that any disturbance might provoke harsh reprisals from the Romans.

Imagine the excitement, concern, and surprise that many of the religious and Roman leaders felt as large crowds professed their belief in Jesus as the Messiah. Was Israel's deliverance at hand? This public acclaim highlighted why some saw Jesus as a threat. The Pharisees, in particular, feared that His messianic identity might undermine the religious authority to which they clung. Most of them dismissed the possibility that Jesus was the Messiah they awaited.

Jesus, however, had a very different understanding of the Passover that year. He knew it was the time for His hour of suffering and death, leading to His glorification. He

- **St. Mary's Environment Committee** will meet at the following times to prepare the environment for Holy Week: Wednesday, April 1 at 9:00 am, and Saturday, April 4 at 8:00 am.
 - **Holy Week Liturgies** This coming week we bring out the most valued treasures of our Church, our most wonderful liturgies! Please make every effort to join us.
 - ♦ **Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper** Unique components to this liturgy are the presentation of oils blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass, the washing of the Feet, and the procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the place of repose. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will follow Mass until 9:00 pm.
 - ♦ **Good Friday The Passion of the Lord** This liturgy has three major components: the liturgy of the word which includes the reading of the lord's passion and death, veneration of the cross, and Holy Communion.
 - ♦ **Easter Vigil** The Easter Vigil is the most beautiful liturgy in the Roman Catholic Church. There are four main parts to the Vigil.
 1. **Service of Light:** The liturgy will begin outdoors with the Service of Light, including the blessing of the new fire, the preparation of the new Paschal candle, the procession into the church and sharing the Light of Christ, and the *Exsultet (the Easter Proclamation), an ancient hymn of praise to the Risen Christ and our hope in salvation.*
 2. **Liturgy of the Word:** The vigil readings capture the faithful promises of God throughout the history of our salvation, from the beginning. We hear the Creation Story; the foreshadowing of Jesus' sacrifice in the story of Abraham and Isaac; the parting of the Red Sea to free Israel from slavery; and the promises of the prophets. Listen for the constant theme of water, since all of this leads to Baptism as our share in the risen life of Jesus, as proclaimed in the Gospel and the return of the Alleluia after our Lenten penance. This year at St. Mary's we will hear readings from Genesis, Exodus, Isaiah, Romans & Matthew. These Scriptures help us to meditate on the wonderful works of God for his people since the beginning of time.
 3. **Baptismal Liturgy:** At St. Mary's we will have 4 Baptisms. The Baptismal liturgy will consist of the blessing of the new water, profession of faith, baptisms and the Rite of Confirmation.
 4. **Liturgy of the Eucharist:** The Mass continues, with special prayers inserted during the Eucharist Prayer. The whole Church is called to join at the sacrificial table that Christ prepared for us through his death and resurrection. The newly confirmed will also receive their first communion. After Communion, we conclude with a solemn blessing and sung dismissal, sending us forth with the Easter Alleluia echoing in our hearts.
- A reception will follow the Easter Vigil.** Please join us to welcome the new members of our community and to celebrate Easter joy.

had no interest in political maneuvering. His sole desire was to fulfill His mission as the Messiah by becoming the one perfect Lamb of Sacrifice whose blood would atone for the sins of many. Jesus was determined and confident as He rode into Jerusalem. Though He knew the suffering that awaited Him, His gaze was fixed on His mission of saving souls. In His sacred humanity, He overcame every temptation to fear or anxiety, allowing peace, strength, and joy to fill His heart.

Not only is Jesus our Savior and the one Mediator between God and us, His human life perfectly models how we are to live. Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem especially models for us how we are to face every difficult situation that tempts us to fear and anxiety. His courage must become our courage, and His determination our determination.

Reflect today on Jesus' interior disposition during His triumphal entry. He invites us to share in His sacrificial love, laying down our lives selflessly for others. This is only possible if we allow His virtues to take root in us every time we are called to imitate His love. As we embrace our own mission, we must not allow fear or anxiety to hinder us. Pray that the courage, peace, and steadfast love that Jesus embodied during that first Holy Week may flourish in your heart. Let go of fear, worry, and selfishness, and allow Jesus' love and strength to fill you, so that His mission may continue through you and, with our Lord, you may lay down your life for others.

Sacrificial Lamb of God, You entered Jerusalem as the new and perfect Lamb of Sacrifice, whose blood would be shed for the salvation of all who turn to You. Please open my heart, dear Lord, to receive all You wish to bestow upon me. Fill me with the virtues You possessed, so that my life will be united to Yours and Your Sacrifice will become alive in me.

Divine Mercy Sunday – What is it?

Divine Mercy is an extraordinary promise that Our Lord makes to us. That whoever goes to confession and worthily receives Him in Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday will receive the forgiveness of sin and all punishment. In fact, the grace that is received on Divine Mercy Sunday is like a second Baptism. For only Baptism forgives all sins and punishment due to sin. Yes, confession remits sins and eternal damnation due to sin, but it may not remove temporal punishment (such as purgatory) due to sin.



How did we learn about Divine Mercy?

The message and devotion of Divine Mercy is based on the apparitions of Jesus to Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska in Poland in the 1930s. Our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. Today, we know that feast as Divine Mercy Sunday, named by Pope St. John Paul II at the canonization of St. Faustina on April 30, 2000.

The Lord expressed His Will regarding this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her *Diary*, entry 699:

*My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. **The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.** On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet... The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy.*

Jesus told Sr. Faustina, **“Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the inscription: Jesus, I trust in You. I desire that this image be venerated first in your chapel, then throughout the world.”**

“Whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment” (diary entry 300).

By doing the following on Divine Mercy Sunday, Our Lord’s promises to grant complete forgiveness of our sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy.

1. Celebrate the Feast (on the Sunday after Easter).
2. Repent of our sins, place our complete trust in Jesus, and go to Confession.
3. Receive Holy Communion on the Feast Day.
4. Venerate the Image of Divine Mercy.
5. Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.
