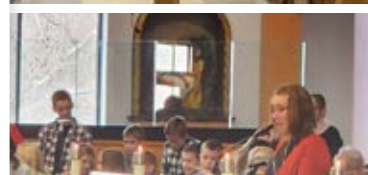
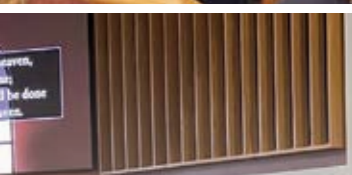

Dear Parishioner,

I believe there is a profound Eucharistic element to stewardship: as Christ gave Himself up for us, so we are called to give ourselves to others. I cannot think of a simpler explanation of what it means to be a Christian steward. To focus on this Eucharistic element, the theme of our annual Stewardship Renewal is “Take, Bless, Break, Give.”

This theme points directly to the mission we have chosen for our parish, which I want to present to you:

Saint Mary’s Catholic Church of Melrose, Minnesota is a community of baptized Christians witnessing to the presence of Jesus Christ in the Roman Catholic tradition. The heart of our believing community is the Church’s sacramental and liturgical life. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we gather regularly to celebrate the presence of Christ in Word and Sacrament. We believe our mission is to praise God, build up God’s kingdom on earth, and respond to God’s call with personal commitment and action:

- by lives of prayer and service to one another;
- by formation of our young people at Saint Mary’s School and religious education;
- by continuing formation of adults;
- by ministering to the special, individual needs of all of God’s people;
- by responsible giving and stewardship of God’s gifts;
- by attending to the material needs of the parish; and
- by reaching out to all with the Good News of Christ in friendship and hospitality.

As you consider our mission, how is our Eucharistic Lord calling you into a deeper relationship with Him? And how is He calling you to better use your gifts and resources within this faith community? Please take a few moments to express His call by filling out your Stewardship Commitment Card.

The Eucharistic Cycle of Stewardship

As Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, we are called to give of ourselves. With grateful hearts, we receive God's gifts, prayerfully nurture them, and share them with others.



Stewardship at Saint Mary's *Being Eucharistic People*

At the last supper, Jesus gave us His Body and Blood, telling us, "Love one another as I have loved you." Then just a few hours later, He made the ultimate sacrifice of love on the cross. The invitation is clear: if Jesus laid down His life for us, we are called to give our lives to others. At Saint Mary's, we call this lifestyle *stewardship*.

This year, during our annual Stewardship Renewal, it is an opportunity to reflect deeply on the source and summit of the life and mission of the Church. We at Saint Mary's strive to live out being a Eucharistic People, which is reflected in our new stewardship theme: *Take, Bless, Break, Give*. As Christ gave Himself to us, so we give ourselves to others.

*All families are asked to use their Commitment Card to make commitments of time, talent, and treasure, then bring the completed card to Mass on **October 28/29**.*

STEWARDSHIP OF *Time*

Worshipping Christ in the Eucharist

As Catholics, the center of our prayer lives is the Eucharist. While we are all called to pray daily — on the way to work, with our family, before bedtime — the heart of our spirituality is receiving Jesus in Communion on the Lord's Day. This year we are placing special emphasis on attending Mass each Sunday, which is not only an obligation, but also a great privilege. On your Commitment Card are listed several other ways to put Jesus at the center of our lives through regular prayer.

Action Steps for Spiritual Growth:

- Make Mass your top priority on Sunday
- Spend time each day in personal prayer
- Make an extra effort to pray before the Blessed Sacrament

Being Christ to Others

Every week, Saint Mary's is buzzing with activity. There are groups that pray together, groups that minister to other parishioners, and groups that reach out to the community. Part of being an active member of our parish is to find your niche — the ministry where your personal talents can best be used. This is what St. Peter meant when he wrote, "As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace" (1 Peter 4:10).

STEWARDSHIP OF *Treasure*

Putting God First in Finances

When Jesus observed a poor widow giving a small contribution to the temple, He remarked to His apostles, “This poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others.” In this touching scene, we learn that our gifts should be *proportionate*: if your income is low, your gift will be small; for those who have more, more is expected. Moreover, we learn from this parable that Christ honors our *sacrifice*; He cherishes the sacrifice we make when we give from our substance rather than from our surplus.

While the Church doesn’t have any hard-and-fast rules for financial support, in Scripture we find that the Israelites were asked to give God 10 percent of their harvest. Thus, the tithe has become a standard for most Christian communities, including Saint Mary’s. We ask that each family prayerfully consider apportioning its tithe as follows:

5% to Saint Mary’s

1% to the diocese

4% to other charities

Action Steps for Financial Generosity:

- Strive to give 5% to Saint Mary’s
- Commit to a specific gift each week or month
- Use your offertory envelopes or Direct Deposit

Children's Choir: Open to those in third through sixth grades; typically sings once per month during school year

Parish Choir: Open to all adults; typically sings twice per month and for seasonal celebrations

Resurrection Choir: Sings for funerals at the request of the deceased's family

Most faith formation sessions (including Confirmation classes) take place on Wednesday evenings, with the exception of First Reconciliation/First Eucharist classes, which are on Saturday mornings. There are many ways to help with the Faith Formation ministry! Teachers and teachers' helpers are always welcome, at any age level, either for one particular night/topic, or for a whole school year. We also appreciate help with once-per-year faith formation liturgies (like the All Saints/All Souls liturgy or Stations of the Cross) and various service projects (like roadside clean-up and Food Shelf collections). Lastly, parishioners can help with providing food/snacks for the faith formation students, especially those who need to come straight from their after-school activities to Wednesday night faith formation.
